MOHICAN BACKPACKER

Friday night we camped at the Group Camp area, sharing the parking lot and smelly latrines with a Cub Scout Pack from Olmsted Falls. Our tents and tarps flapped through the windy night.

We got up and made breakfast Saturday morning in temperatures not much above freezing. Then the long hikers were shuttled to their entry point.
