Eagle Scout Biographies

Alex

Alex Barnes was born on April 12, 1984 in Cleveland Heights, where he has lived his whole life. He entered the troop in May of 1995; early in the following year he got his first taste of the Klondike Derby competition, winning second place by one point as a member of the Hellbender patrol. Alex's first experience as a leader came three years later when he became Eric Kalynchuk's Assistant Patrol Leader for the Griffon patrol. As the Assistant Patrol Leader he got his first taste of leadership teaching the younger scouts about the values of being a Boy Scout as well as winning his first Klondike Derby in the year 2000. Later in March of that year, he was named the Patrol Leader of the Griffon patrol. By 2001, when he was named Mark Rodney's Assistant Senior Patrol Leader, he had earned five Klondike top three finishes in six years of participation with one first place finish, three second place finishes, and one third place finish. He has also attended the Algonquin and Isle Royale High Adventures in 2000 and 2001. Alex's Eagle project involved landscaping for a United Way non-profit organization called University Settlements, which provides transitional Housing for the homeless.

From here Alex will be attending Denison University next year after graduating from University School and is excited about a bright future as an Eagle Scout.

Andrew Kohan has lived in Cleveland Heights since his birth in 1983. He crossed over to Troop 22 in 1995 from Cub Scout Pack 11. After three years in the Raven Patrol, Andrew became the Assistant Patrol Leader of the Troll Patrol in 1998. With Pat Murray he ran the First Aid event at district Klondike Derbies in 1999 and 2000, adding more variety to the injuries of the "victims." Andrew became the patrol leader of the first-year Raptor Patrol in the spring of 2000.

Outside of scouting, Andrew has been the Editor-in-Chief and Managing Editor of *The Black & Gold* newspaper at Cleveland Heights High School, as well as a representative to Student Council, and member of the Forensics team, Political Awareness Club and National Honor Society. Andrew will attend The George Washington University in Washington, D.C.

Andrew's Eagle project reorganized a storage room at the new offices of Interact Cleveland, an interfaith organization that provides summer and after-school activities for young people in the Cleveland area as one part of its mission. Andrew directed six other scouts in cleaning the room and building 256 square feet of shelf space to organize the games, toys and records stored in the room.
