Kevin Coburn

Kevin Coburn was born on December 19, 1986, and attended Canterbury Elementary School and Wiley Middle School. He is a senior at Heights High where he has been involved in journalism, swimming, and music. For the last two years he has been one of two Drum Majors with the Marching Band, and is a



National Honor Society inductee. He also has been playing French horn in two chamber ensembles, the Arioso Woodwind Quintet and the Brass Choir, in addition to the Symphony and trumpet in Jazz Band. He will pursue his obsession with math in college next year.

Kevin's first campout with Troop 22 was in sixth grade, tenting on top of the snow on a cold January weekend. He was hooked. He was an Assistant Patrol Leader as well as Patrol Leader for the Stingrayz for 2 years and the Cobras for 1 year. His current position with the Troop is as Junior Assistant Scout Master and Service Project Coordinator.

Kevin's Eagle Scout project was a fish survey. The Doan Brook Watershed project has recommended that the portion of the brook running alongside Martin Luther King Boulevard be freed. Currently it is channelized and walled, and since the water flows through quickly fish do not breed there. If the walls are removed, the brook will form pools and riffles which will provide breeding habitat. Under the guidance of his father, an ichthyologist, and Keith Jones, Doan Brook Watershed project director, Kevin and his band of Scouts seined in portions of the brook both alongside MLK and upstream near the Nature Center at Shaker Lakes to provide data on current fish populations to compare with subsequent surveys once the brook is freed.

James Kastelic

James Kastelic was born on October 23, 1986, and attended Canterbury Elementary School and Wiley Middle School. He is a senior at Heights High where he has been involved in the German Club, Political Action Club, and was on the Cross Country running



team. He also plays the oboe, works part-time for an elderly neighbor, and is a National Honor Society inductee. He has applied to several colleges and is interested in studying political science, business, and law.

James became a Tiger Cub in kindergarten, and was with Pack 3 at Oxford Elementary School before bridging over to Troop 22. He was happy to follow his older brother, Rob, into the Troop because of all the great camping they do and focus on learning skills. He has been both the Quartermaster and Librarian for the Troop, in addition to Assistant Patrol Leader. His current position with the Troop is as Junior Assistant Scout Master.

James' Eagle Scout project involved removal of invasive, nonnative plant species from the mini-marsh area at the Shaker Lakes Nature Center. He and the Scouts removed Yellow Flag Iris and Deadly Nightshade, and then planted native species including various sedges, grasses, and Blue Flag Iris so that they will spread throughout the marsh area. Over the course of several muddy hours, James enjoyed explaining to many curious minimarsh visitors what his project entailed and how it will benefit the Nature Center.

James is grateful to Ari Klein and Troop 22 scouts and adults, friends, family, and especially his teachers and counselors throughout his public school education who have supported him. James thanks the staff of the Shaker Lakes Nature Center for facilitating his Eagle project.
