BIOGRAPHIES

Peter Markus joined Troop 22 in the newly formed Copperhead patrol in 1993. He advanced quickly, soon becoming Assistant Patrol Leader of the Cobra patrol. Shortly thereafter, he took over leadership of the Hellbender Patrol as Patrol Leader. Peter continued to advance, eventually reaching the rank of Life and holding many other positions within the troop, including Quartermaster, Scribe, and Instructor. Peter went on three high adventures, earned four Klondike medals and also earned the 150+50 award for 150 nights of camping and 50 hours of community service. Peter's Eagle Scout project was the complete renovation of the children's play area at the Zelma George Shelter for Battered Women, as well as some painting of the home's dining room.

In high school, Peter played Midget Hockey and was a member of the Varsity Tennis team and was named to the Northeast Ohio All League First Team. After graduating from Cleveland Heights High School in 2000, Peter enrolled at Tufts University in Boston. Peter is majoring in Computer Science, and was named to the Dean's List both of his semesters there. He is also a member of the Theta Delta Chi fraternity. After college, Peter hopes to either work as a computer consultant or to start a Fortune 500 Company with his brother Andrew.

Matthew Resseger joined Boy Scouts, along with fellow Eagle Brendan Knoblauch in the spring of 1994 as a member of the Eagle Patrol. He was a member of that patrol for three years serving as Assistant Patrol Leader in the third year. He was elected Scorpion Patrol Leader the following year. The next year he again served as a Patrol Leader, this time for the newly created Thunderbolt Patrol. In March of his sophomore year, he was elected to the office of Senior Patrol Leader. During his senior year, he was a Junior Assistant Scoutmaster until he turned eighteen. As a Scout, Matt was a member of four Klondike medal winning patrols, including the first place Eagle Patrol in 1996, and went on five high adventure trips. He earned

the 150+50 award for 150 nights of camping and 50 hours of community service in 1999. Matt completed his Eagle Project by doing painting, landscaping and flooring in a house on Ansel and Ninety-Fifth that the Famicos Foundation was remodeling as the home for a family with five foster children.

Matt recently graduated from Cleveland Heights High School, where he was a member of the Heights High Symphony, Trio Con Brio and the Heights Track and Cross Country teams. He was also a member of the Cleveland Orchestra Youth Orchestra. He plans to attend Williams College where he hopes to continue running and performing music. He would like to thank his parents, his sister, Ari, Brendan Knoblauch, his patrol leaders, Marc Petre and John Rodney, his track and cross-country coaches, Claude Holland, Steve Warner, and Mary Watson, and his music teachers and directors, Danna Sundet, Betty Zimmer, and Dr. Mayer, for support and guidance.

Brendan Knoblauch joined the troop in 1994 with Matthew Resseger in the Eagle Patrol. During Brendan's second year he won the first of his two first place Klondike Medals. He also earned the 150+50 award for 150 nights of camping and 50 hours of community service. Brendan got his first taste of leadership when he became Assistant Patrol Leader of the Scorpions under fellow inductee Matthew. Soon thereafter he earned the privilege of leading his own patrol, the Hawks. On the road to Eagle, Brendan also held the positions of Troop Scribe and Assistant Senior Patrol Leader. For his Eagle Project he built stairs and shelving for INTERACT Cleveland at their hunger center. Brendan played football for Cleveland Heights High School for four years. He was also active in the Political Awareness Club. On September 17, Brendan will be shipping out for the United States Marine Corps. There he hopes to see many different places and have many life experiences before he goes to college.
