NATHAN WILSON

Nathan Wilson was born in 1987 in Cleveland Heights. He attended Oxford Elementary School and Monticello Middle School before moving to Shaker Heights. He graduated from Shaker Heights High School, where he was on the soccer team and played trumpet in the school's marching and concert bands. He is



currently a nursing major at Seton Hall University in New Jersey. He is involved in the Students Nursing Association and Habitat for Humanity. Nathan loves visiting nearby New York City.

Nathan has been a scout since kindergarten, when he became a Tiger Cub in Pack 3. He joined Troop 22 in May of his 5th grade year. He was the troop's first-aid instructor for one year and helped coordinate and run the first-aid event at Klondike. He served Troop 22 as Quartermaster and as the patrol leader of the Thunder Dragons. Nathan received the Troop 22 150/50 award for 150 nights of camping and 50 hours of service. Danny began scouts in second grade by joining Cub Scout Pack 11 with several of his classmates. He stayed with scouting all the way, even though the friends he started with had all stopped participating in scouts. Danny crossed over to Troop 22 in 1997 and was very anxious about the program. He had a rocky first few years, but by the time he was in high school he found his niche; he took a stronger liking to the program, specifically backpackers and winter campouts. Andy was on the varsity soccer, swim, and lacrosse teams, played euphonium in the IMD, and was active in his church community and youth group at First Unitarian Church in Shaker Heights.
