BIOGRAPHIES

Jeremy Paul crossed over to Troop 22 from Webelos Troop 222 in 1993 and joined the Eagle Patrol. He was a member of the Wombat Patrol that became the Hellbender Patrol where he served as Scribe from 1996-7. He was Assistant Patrol Leader of the newly formed Badger Patrol in 1997 and was elected Patrol Leader the following year. In 1999 he was elected Assistant Senior Patrol Leader and in 2000 was made Instructor. Jeremy was a member of three Klondike medal winning patrols, including the first place Wombat Patrol in 1997. He earned 34 merit badges, 100 nights of camping and the God and Country Award. Jeremy attended Camp Manatoc for 6 summers including one as a staff member. For his Eagle Project, he constructed dressing rooms and storage units for costumes and props at Benedictine High School, and organized the storage areas for the Drama Program and Student Council.

Jeremy recently graduated with honors from Benedictine High School as class Salutatorian. He was on Dean's list every semester and was a National Merit Finalist. He was editor of The Bennet and a member of the Drama, Film and Latin Clubs, Benetones and B Sharps Singing Groups, Cross Country team and Beaumont's Mixed Ensemble and Show Choir. He was elected to National Honor Society in 1999. A veteran of ten theater productions, Jeremy won the 2001 Shakespeare Competition of the Cleveland English Speaking Union and went on to the National ESU Competition. He will attend Wesleyan University in Connecticut where he plans to study for a career in theater or film.

Aric Kalynchuk was born on July 5, 1983. He attended Ruffing Montessori School and Wiley Middle School, and graduated this spring from Cleveland Heights High School. He plans to continue his education at The Ohio State University. His planned courses of study are psychiatry and accounting.

Aric's hobbies include playing the tuba, photography, and camping. In January he earned an honorable mention for his work in photography. He first became interested in scouting as a Cub Scout and joined Troop 22 in 1994 as a member of Eagle patrol. He remained there through 1996 when he earned the rank of first class. In 1997 he was elected patrol leader of the Eagle patrol. Six months later he moved to the Raven patrol after the Eagles broke up. During this period Aric was also a den chief for the future Griffin patrol. In 1998 he was appointed the Griffin's patrol leader and reelected for another term a year later. In 1999 Aric was elected Senior Patrol Leader. He was also elected to The Order of the Arrow and just this past year, earned 200 nights of camping and 50 nights of service. In May of 2001 Aric completed his Eagle Scout Project. While being supplied with paint, stencils, and safety cones, half of the storm drains in University Heights were spray painted with "Do not dump, drains to lake" signs under Aric's supervision. Work crews also distributed door fliers to homeowner's doors in order to encourage no dumping. The project helps to prevent people from disposing of pollutants that will drain untreated into Greater Cleveland's waters. A total of 102.5 man hours were volunteered by work crews.
